the labor of jans birth began at the san francisco opera house in a world war ii blackout during the second act of rigoletto jan pierce tenor jans namesake from then he has been haunted by the musical sounds and meanings of words and the silences in between them being nurtured in a devoutly religious but intensely artistic home his hauntings soon took the form of poetry despite his many academic degrees and varied professional careers his poetry has survived as his primary personal calling the author of five previous books burning bush 1985 particles of thought 1988 both university flaming arrow press ibis of imaginings a poetic diary editorama poesia 1995 loom telar in 2005 and suite de la habana in 2006 both edicions union uneac cuba in which otterstrom recounts a peculiar poetic odyssey as he decided to abandon the security of his business career to return to an inner home which became havana cuba to discover its importance to his destiny as poet this book gatherings sections park levels orderly arrangements and gatherings is a collection of poems from 2006 until 2011 during this time jan has continued to travel between costa rica and cuba having sensed a spiritual link between him and what he feels and sees in these countries otterstrom experiences a wide range of literary scientific and mathematical knowledge in his poetry

lorna goodison is a poet alive to places from the loved and lived in world of jamaica where she began and started a family to the united states and canada where she has made her teaching career but always re connecting with her caribbean roots she travels with an ear alert to histories and voices how differently english sounds in the tropi and in colder lands at seaside in sunlight and on prairies mountains and in cities the same words say quite different things depending on who speaks them and who s listening obeying or resisting she covers a wide range of subjects and themes too her instinct is to celebrate being alive in a world that is rich but in peril and what is the rare quality that has gone out of poetry that these marvellous poems restore asks derek walcott joy the mango of poetry eaten straight from the tree

all of the published poetry of james baldwin including six significant poems previously only available in a limited edition during his lifetime 1924 1987 james baldwin authored seven novels as well as several plays and essay collections which were published to wide spread praise these books among them notes of a native son the fire next time giovanni s room and go tell it on the mountain brought him well deserved acclaim as a public intellectual and admiration as a writer however baldwin s earliest writing was in poetic form and baldwin considered himself a poet throughout his lifetime nonetheless his single book of poetry jimmy s blues never achieved the popularity of his novels and nonfiction and is the one and only book to fall out of print this new collection presents james baldwin the poet including all nineteen poems from jimmy s blues as well as all the poems from a limited edition volume called gypsy of which only 325 copies were ever printed and which was in production at the time of his death known for his relentless honesty and startlingly prophetic insights on issues of race gender class and poverty baldwin is just as enlightening and bold in his poetry as in his famous novels and essays the poems range from the extended dramatic narratives of staggerlee wonders and gypsy to the lyrical beauty of some days which has been set to music and interpreted by such acclaimed artists as audra mcdonald nikky finney s introductory essay reveals the importance relevance and rich rewards of these little known works baldwin s many devotees will find much to celebrate in these pages
