ethiopia has had four constitutions throughout its history the 1931 version the 1955 version the 1987 version and the 1995 version which is currently in effect until the adoption of the first of these constitutions the concepts of ethiopian government had been codified in the kebra nagast which presented the concept that the legitimacy of the emperor of ethiopia was based on its asserted descent from king solomon of ancient israel and the fetha nagast a legal code used in ethiopia at least as early as 1450 to define the rights and responsibilities of the monarch and subjects as defined by the ethiopian orthodox tewahedo church

protection they give recognition to the rights for local people participation land holding and benefit sharing while government running the development projects however there is no legislation giving special treatment and criteria for the identification of indigenous people the indigenous people living in and around awash national park do not have secured land rights there are not specific guidelines that entitle them to participate in the national park management moreover the government has not yet adopted schemes that enable them to share benefits from the national park indigenous people are not enjoying constitutional guarantees due to lack of detailed rules and strategies for implementation
