Art Therapy with Children 2008 fostering emotional safety the perception of acceptance clients feel that allows them to share vulnerable material within the therapeutic environment is a major component of building a therapeutic alliance the emotional self disclosure scale esds measured emotional safety through fifteen randomly assigned participants willingness to disclose emotions before and after an art or writing intervention results showed no significant difference between post esds scores for art and writing pre and post happiness scores in both conditions as well as pre and post apathy scores in the art condition were significant within the art making condition results also showed a difference though not meeting a standard of significance in emotional safety between those who utilized a fluid art material versus a restrictive one relevant follow up experiments and directions for future research should include studies on restrictive versus fluid materials as well as longitudinal studies on emotional safety
