the manual is intended to inform field managers and operational agencies of the issues related to reproductive health affecting women adolescents and men in refugee situations and to serve as a tool to help implement monitor and evaluate reproductive health related interventions the purposes of the field manual are 1 to focus attention on and familiarize field staff with an aspect of refugee rights and welfare which has been too often widely overlooked 2 to offer guidance to field staff in introducing and implementing reproductive health services in refugee situations 3 to foster coordination between potential partners the manual describes the components of a comprehensive reproductive health service these should be adapted to each situation as not all components will be equally relevant in each each chapter begins with a summary of its contents chapters one and two cover important general topics the following chapters cover a specific aspect of reproductive health helpful tools for project implementation and a list of further reading are provided as appropriate as chapter annexes appendices at the end of the manual contain essential documents on information education and communication iec legal considerations a glossary of terms used in the manual and an evaluation form
